

St. Feuillien FIVE

Brasserie St. Feuillien, Le Roeulx, Belgium

Founded in 1873

Belgian Pale Blonde, 5.0% ABV



The Brasserie St. Feuillien (“Foo-Yen”) had its start in the 7th century, when an Irish monk named Foylan—a name which later morphed into the more French “Feuillien”—was killed in the village of Le Roeulx. A chapel was built in his honor, which, over time, became the Abbey St. Feuillien du Roeulx. The abbey featured a brewery to support itself, but was destroyed in the French Revolution. In 1873 the Friart family resumed brewing operations and to this day a portion of the proceeds is donated to charitable causes around the world, making St. Feuillien one of Belgium’s oldest and most authentic Abbey Ales.

St. Feuillien FIVE is a refreshing 5% ABV bottle-conditioned pale blond ale with a strong, sparkling character emitting fine bubbles. Delicate fruity hints empowered by nuances of citrus zests give way to a delightfully fresh and hoppy aroma. It is a flavorful, sweet and malty and full-bodied beer with a pleasant balance post-bitterness, and it pours with a stable head of white foam. This a light and refreshing blond beer with a capacity as a thirst quencher. “Don’t hesitate to put this into your rotation of summertime beers”. It is easy to drink and charms you in a natural way. Brugse Zot

Brauerei Brouwerij De Halve Maan

Founded in 1856

Belgian Blonde, 6.0% ABV



Beer has been brewed at De Halve Maan's location since 1564. The current brewery has been family-owned and operated since 1856, passing through six generations of the family tree. For decades, the family brewers have strived to offer world-class beer, both in quality and taste, whilst remaining true to their traditions, and the art of brewing. The brewery has developed award-winning recipes which are dearly beloved by the citizens of Bruges, and the world beyond. In 2016 Halve Maan built a beer pipeline beneath the medieval streets. The tube transports 1,000 gallons of beer per hour (12,000 bottles) to its bottling plant two miles away. Visitors can glimpse a section of the pipeline through a transparent manhole cover cut into the cobblestone street.

Brugse Zot is the official table beer of the city of Bruges, Brugse Zot is a delicious blonde beer, brewed according to a unique and traditional recipe. Brugse Zot is a very drinkable thirst-quencher with bags of character, brewed with four varieties of malt and two types of aroma hops. Thanks to refermentation the taste evolves in the bottle.

Jever Pilsener

Friesisches Brauhaus zu Jever, Jever, Germany

Founded in 1848

German Pilsener, 4.9% ABV



Hardly any other premium beer has remained as true to itself as Jever. It typifies the very dry style of Pilsener from Friesland in the north-west corner of Germany. This refreshing beer, lagered for an impressive 90 days, has been made with the same pure, soft water from the same well for over 170 years. Unique in taste, Jever is considered the finest German Pilsener. The late beer connoisseur, Michael Jackson, rated this beer as the only 4-star Pilsener in Germany.

Bright gold and sparkling clear, Jever’s high carbonation gives an attractive appearance as well as a clean, crisp finish. Grassy and floral notes are accompanied by a distinct graininess.

Ottakringer Helles

Ottakringer Brauerei, Vienna, Austria

Founded in 1873

Austrian Viennese Lager, 5.3% ABV



As Vienna’s oldest brewery, they have been known for having the highest quality and an extraordinary diversity of flavor for over 180 years. Their brewery resides in the heart of Vienna and has developed into a pulsating event location in accordance with their cosmopolitan flair. There, in the heart of Ottakring, culinary, and culture blend into a unique, delicious mixture.

The only authentic Viennese Lager available in the United States. This historic beer composition made from Viennese malt and melanoidin malt as well as fine Saaz hops captivates you with its eye-catching amber-colored reflexes. Smell and taste reveal a fine nutty note turning into an elegant malt aroma. In its finish, our Vienna Lager leaves a distinct, yet smooth bitterness.



Altvater Weissbierbock

Brauerei Bischofshof, Regensburg, Germany

Founded in 1649

Wheat Bock, 7.1% ABV

The Bischofshof Brewery was founded in 1649 near the famous Cathedral of Regensburg by Bishop Wilhelm Graf von Wartenberg; although historians have evidence that a brewery for the Bishops already existed in 1280 AD, and actually had been providing beer during the construction of the Regensburger Cathedral from 1280 to 1520. Today the Brewery is still owned by the Diocese, and combines tradition with the latest brewing technology.

Tradition meets progress. Perfect wheat beer enjoyment with 7.1% vol alcohol. The full-bodied fruity taste with a fine yeast note conjures up a unique taste experience. Tasty and strong! Newly brewed by the Bischofshof brewery in homage to 500 years of purity law from 1516. Then as now, a very special beer with a special history.

Zoller-Hof Zwickl

Brauerei Zoller-Hof, Sigmaringen, Germany

Founded in 1845

Zwicklbier, 5.5% ABV



Great things come to those who wait... Zoller-Hof's high standards in quality reflect the German beer brewing culture. Their traditional fermentation and a 6-week maturation in ice cold tanks is the big difference between their beers and the industrially produced discount beers who in general mature beer 2-4 weeks.

Nostalgic in design and taste. "Zoller" Zwickl is a unfiltered barley-wheat lager, brewed according to old recipes from the Zoller-Hof brewery. This beer is designed to bring about nostalgia equal in taste as well as appearance. The best recipe demonstrates the classic German style Zwickl. From the first sip, this lager conquers with its softness and richness of taste. Bitterness is almost unnoticeable in it, but freshness, honey-malt notes and fragrant hops prevail.

Tucher Braü Dunkels Hefe

Tucher Braü, Furth-Nuremberg, Germany

Founded in 1672

Dark Wheat, 5.2% ABV



At Tucher Traditionsbrauerei's two-city Brewhouse, the brewery's unique story is built into its name, as the building straddles the border between Furth and Nuremberg, Germany - two Northern Bavarian cities with proud heritages. So prevalent is this cultural divide, that the border is marked throughout the brewery for all to see. The Tucher has been producing remarkably consistent and clean beer for more than 350 years. A brewing range that stretches from their iconic wheat beers to an oak-aged Rotbier native to Nuremberg adheres to Bavarian brewing heritage across the board. With the cleanest of water sourced from the brewery's own wells and a dedication to only using first-generation yeast, the Reinheitsgebot (German Purity Law) is alive and well in its beers.

Tucher Dunkels Hefe is a dark wheat for beer connoisseurs: The taste is smooth and crisp with a medium body. It retains some breadly sweetness because of the wheat malts with flavors of rip fruit and a hint of caramel. There are subtle spice flavors as well, such as clove. Nutty yeast and a faint chocolate flavor are also present. Tucher Dunkels Hefeweizen is balanced and finishes clean. Tucher Dunkels Weiss is one of four beautifully brewed beers available in the United States.

Praga Premium Pilsner

Pivovar Samson, Prague, Czech Republic

Founded in 1845

Czech Pilsner, 4.7% ABV



Based upon 200 year old traditional Czech recipes, Praga is brewed at the historic Brevnov Monastery. Established in Prague, Czech Republic in 993 AD, the monks of the Brevnov Monastery are recognized as having established the very first Czech brewery. The Brevnov Monastery is now a privately owned microbrewery dedicated to continuing its thousand-year-old Czech brewing tradition.

This authentic Czech Pils is rich in Saaz hops and brewed following a 200-year old tradition by Czech brew masters. This is a crisp, refreshing beer with less carbonation making it less filling and packed with flavor.
