U.S.-German Climate and Energy Partnership *Good for business and the environment?*

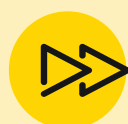
In July of 2021, President Joe Biden and Chancellor Angela Merkel launched the U.S.-German Climate and Energy Partnership.

Develop emissions policies, coordinate on climate and trade agendas, and mobilize financing for sustainable development.



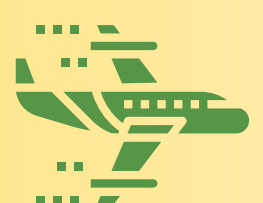
- > **Collaborating to develop transformational energy technologies**

- > **Helping energy transitions in emerging economies**
Assist emerging economies develop sustainable energy and prevent the use of energy as a political tool.
